From the Superintendent-Mr. Collins

The school year got off to a flying and “hot” start. Thankfully the team replacing the Elementary HVAC units were able to complete a majority of the project before classes resumed. We did have a couple of areas that were delayed a week or so such as the elementary gym, but that has been completed. The heat wave did force us to move practice and game times and we are thankful for the return of more seasonal weather. If you have the opportunity I invite you to get out and watch our kids perform in activities as well as athletics.

The Board finalized the budget at their September meeting. In the General Operating Fund we reduced the tax request \$327,174 in part due to additional state funds we are needing for the General Fund. We did increase the Budgeted expenses in the General Fund 2.95%. The Board did approve an increased tax request to the Special Building Fund as we continue to have improvement and building needs. Overall the total tax request in all district taxing funds was reduced \$75,505 and the levy in all funds was slightly more than 6 cents. The Board and Administration continue to evaluate programs and make choices to best serve our students while being stewards of funding we have.

Finally, at the September Board meeting I informed the Board of my intention to retire in June at the end of my 2023-2024 contract term. I wanted to make this announcement early enough to allow the Board and community ample time to conduct a search and hire a high quality candidate. I have thoroughly enjoyed my 14 years at Wilber Clatonia and my 42 ½ years in education. Thank you for all of your support and assistance in helping Wilber Clatonia students become the best people they can be.

"Help Them Fight the Flu So They Can Do What They Do"

Public Health Solutions does not want you to get sick with the flu. When more people get the flu vaccine, many less people will become sick with the flu and thus there will be less people spreading influenza to others. This is especially important if you are around infants 6 months or younger or the elderly as they are at a greater risk to have serious complications due to flu. Most healthy school aged children may not experience flu complications, but could risk exposing an elderly grandparent or baby brother/sister to the virus.

Public Health Solutions District Health Department will again be offering flu immunization clinics for students at your school. Prior to the start of clinics, students will bring home consent forms and fact sheets explaining the importance of getting the flu immunization. Parents and guardians are encouraged to read the information carefully, complete and sign the consent form, and send it back to school with their student.

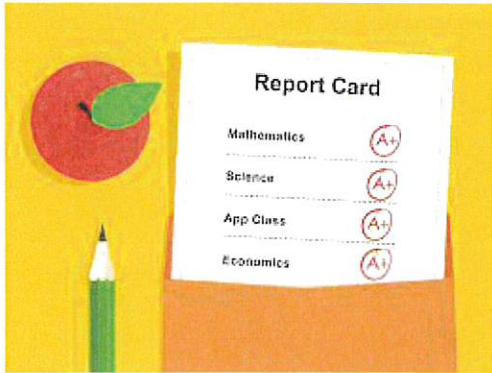

Report cards



W-C's secondary staff worked to create a common grading policy at the end of last year that we have implemented this fall. The goal of this policy was to create some consistency and can be found in the student handbook.

These common policies have resulted in some changes to what report cards will look like. All classes are semester long in length and grades for all courses will be a running grade that continues to

update throughout the semester. The report card will be a snapshot of the grade at that moment in time. The final grade for the semester will be determined at the conclusion of the semester. This means that a student's grade will not restart at the quarter. Since the grade is fluid throughout the entire semester, we are encouraging parents to check grades via PowerSchool periodically. Please contact the high school office if you need help setting up an account through PowerSchool. If you use the PowerSchool app on a mobile device, you can set up notifications for grade changes to be sent to you as they occur.

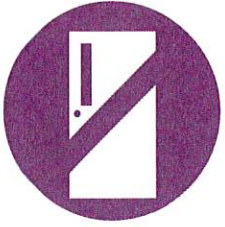


Standard Response Protocol (SRP)

Wilber Clatonia, like most schools in the United States, uses the SRP or Standard Response Protocol when responding to any potential emergency and for safety drills. The SRP provides consistent, clear, shared language and actions among all students, staff and first responders, that can be applied in any emergency. Throughout the school year, staff and students will practice the different protocols so that our response becomes consistent and automatic. So far this year we have already held three evacuation drills, one shelter drill, and one lockdown drill.

On the next page, please review the poster summarizing the actions that take place during each protocol. Please review these actions with your student to help support our efforts to keep your student safe while in our building. If we are in a Secure or Lockdown protocol please be aware that the entrances into and out of the school will be locked. We will not allow guests, parents, students, or visitors to enter or exit during those times, even during a drill situation. This may be an inconvenience if you are picking a student up for an appointment or needing to drop something off, but again for the safety of our students and staff we will adhere to the protocol. Thank you for your understanding and support of our drills.

IMPORTANT UPCOMING CHANGES to FAFSA FILING!!!

ALL HIGH SCHOOL PARENTS NEED TO BE AWARE OF THESE CHANGES!!!! This will impact current seniors.

The Better FAFSA for 2024-25 and it will impact ALL STUDENTS as beginning with this year's senior class, the FAFSA will be REQUIRED for all students planning to attend any college or trade school.

Federal Student Aid is making changes to the FAFSA that could significantly affect students who complete the FAFSA for the 2024-25 academic year. The federal government calls this the Better FAFSA.

Summary of Changes

FAFSA Opening Date

The 2024-25 FAFSA will not open until December 2023.

THIS IS IMPORTANT TO DO NOW.

BOTH the STUDENT and ONE parent need to create a FSA ID. This is the electronic signature for the FAFSA filing. IF, as parents, you created an ID for a older child, you will use the same ID for all children in your family. Go to <https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/launch> to create your account. Class of 2024 students need to create an ID as well. KEEP these as you will use them throughout your college days. Create a file and WRITE the information down!

FSA IDs

Student and parents must create a Student Aid Account (FSA ID) – including parents without a Social Security number.

- ✚ If parents file as married filing jointly – *only one parent FSA ID is required.*
- ✚ If parents are unmarried but live together or are married and filing taxes separately, *both parents must have an FSA ID.*
- ✚ The Social Security Administration must verify the FSA IDs **before** a FAFSA can be started (allow 3 days)
- ✚ FSA IDs will use two-factor authentication.

Expected Family Contribution (EFC)

The EFC, which will become the SAI, is the MAIN number necessary to determine the amount of aid students are eligible to receive. In the past, if the EFC was below \$10,000, the student was eligible for the Susan Thompson Buffet scholarship. The lower the EFC, the more eligible the student became including the PELL Grant and lower interest student loans. With the changes, I am unsure of what the cutoff will be, but I will keep everyone posted.

The EFC will become **SAI** (Student Aid Index).

- ✚ SAI better reflects the FAFSA results, not what a family is expected to pay.
- ✚ The number in college will no longer factor into the SAI calculation.
- ✚ The SAI or federal poverty tables will determine Pell Grant eligibility.

Login and Demographic Information

- ✚ The student must provide the legal name, Social Security number (SSN), birthdate, and email of the parent(s) who will contribute to the FAFSA (if no SSN, a mailing address will be required). The parent(s) will then receive an email to add their information to the existing form.
- ✚ Parents and students must log in separately to complete their respective sections.

- ✦ Students and parents must give consent to retrieve and disclose federal tax information. This includes non-tax filers, those without Social Security numbers, and foreign tax filers.
- ✦ Demographic survey questions will include expanded ethnicity and race options.

Financial Information

- ✦ If the biological parents are separated or divorced, the FAFSA will require financial information from the parent(s) who provided the most financial support to the student (it used to be the parent the student lived with most in the last 12 months).
- ✦ Parent(s) will now report these items as an asset:
 - Child support **received**
 - Net worth of a business
 - Net worth of a family farm
- ✦ Parent(s) will no longer report child support **paid**.
- ✦ The FAFSA will no longer require these untaxed items:
 - Payments to tax-deferred retirement or pensions
 - Veteran's non-educational benefit
 - Worker's compensation

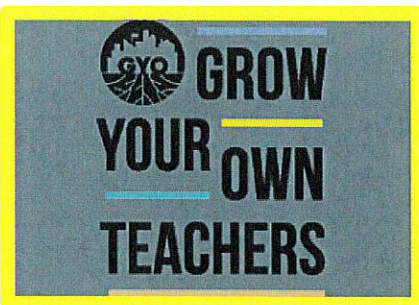

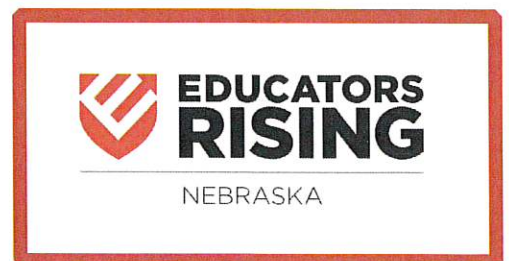

Fantastic Opportunity for our Students!

In cooperation with ESU 6 in Milford, ESU 9 in Hastings, and Wayne State College, the Grow Your Own (GYO) Initiative opportunity has landed at W-C! This past summer, I spent two days learning about this incredible program to help to encourage students to consider a career in education. Currently, five students (two seniors, two juniors, and one sophomore) are taking Intro to Teacher Education, the introductory course offered through Wayne State College. This is a

hybrid course that incorporates online coursework with job shadowing and collaboration experience. An added bonus? Tuition for this course (and the courses this spring) are being paid through a grant that ESUs 6 & 9 received. Students from across the area are involved in this program. Not only are the students able to get this experience, but the grant also covers both the state and national dues for Educators Rising, which is a community-based movement, in which **chapters at schools** feed teacher preparation programs at institutes of higher education with the support of **State Departments of Education** and local funders and foundations. These entities come together to **provide a clear pathway to increase teacher diversity** and teacher quality.



Grow Your Own (GYO) teacher programs are partnerships between school districts, institutions of higher education, and community-based organizations to recruit and prepare community members to become teachers in local schools (Gist et al., 2019). GYO programs are associated with positive outcomes for teachers, students, and their communities--especially for diverse student populations (Clewell & Villegas, 2001; Gist et al., 2019; Lau et al., 2007). Additionally, these programs are a key strategy to address the bilingual teacher shortage.

We are so fortunate to be able to offer this amazing opportunity to our students!

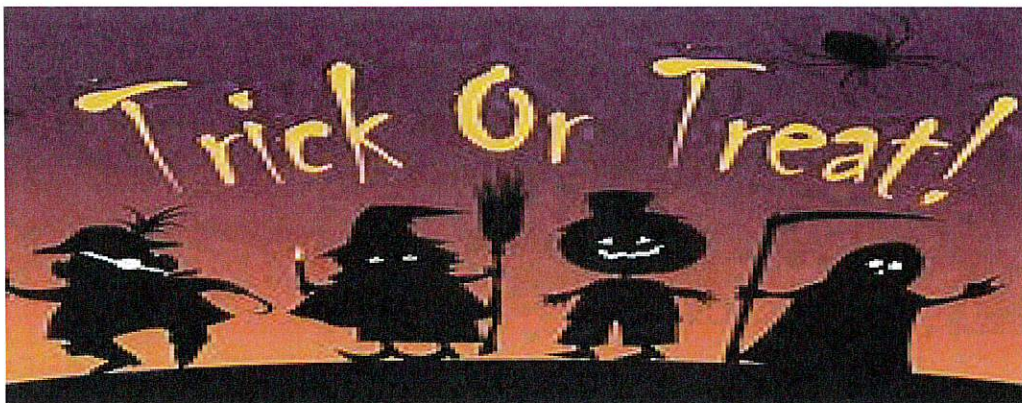

NEW LUNCH SYSTEM

We have a new lunch system in place for the school year. You will no longer be able to see the transactions or balances for your students on PowerSchool. You can go to our website www.wilberclatonia.org and choose the lunch balances button or foodservice.edutrak.com and set up an account. In order to do this you will need your student's lunch id number and a family key member. Please contact Connie in the District office (connie.hasenohr@wilberclatonia.org) to get this information. Once you have an account set up you can choose the lunch balances on the website to check balances or see the transactions.

Your students have been set up with a family account. If you have multiple students the money will go into one family account and will be split evenly among them. There is also a button on our website that says lunch payment, where you can make online payments for the lunch accounts.

The system is also set up to automatically send emails out to parents when the account is low or negative. It will continue to send these until the account is paid.

This has been a process to get it set up and working. I know we still have a few bugs we are working out. If you have any questions, please contact us and we will do our best to answer them or fix the issues.

Students in Grades 6-12 are allowed to get extras. If you want to set limits on how many extras your child can get, please contact Janet Slama in the Kitchen or email janet.slama@wilberclatonia.org.

OFFER VERSUS SERVE (OVS)

Tip Sheet for School Food Service Managers



School Breakfast Program

What is OVS?

The goal of OVS is to reduce food waste while allowing students to choose the foods they want to eat. Everyone plays a role. When students and cafeteria staff understand OVS, breakfast lines move smoothly, allowing students to make the most of meal time and enjoy the wholesome and appealing foods they are served. It also helps reduce overall food costs.

Under OVS at breakfast, schools must offer at least four food items from the three required food components (fruit, grains, and fluid milk*).

- A **food component** is one of three required food groups in a reimbursable breakfast. These are fruits, grains, and fluid milk*.
- A **food item** is a specific food offered within the three food components, for example, 2 slices of whole grain-rich bread, 1 cup of grapes, and 1 cup of milk. This meal meets OVS breakfast requirements because three food components and four food items are offered.

Students must select at least three of the four offered food items under OVS at breakfast, including at least ½ cup of fruit and/or vegetable. Please note, OVS is optional at breakfast for all grade levels.

Required Components at Breakfast



Fruit

1 cup



Grains

1 ounce equivalent
(oz eq)



Fluid Milk*

1 cup

Sample OVS breakfast menu:

Variety of milk*: fat free or low-fat (1 cup milk)
 Slice of whole grain-rich toast (1 oz eq grain)
 Whole grain-rich cereal (1 oz eq grain)
 Orange slices (1 cup fruit)

Optional Components at Breakfast

Vegetables

- Vegetables may be offered as a substitute for fruits.

Meats/Meat Alternates

- A meat/meat alternate may be served to meet the weekly grain requirement, as long as a 1 oz eq minimum of grains is offered daily.
- A meat/meat alternate may also be offered as an "extra" food (not credited toward meal pattern requirements) if a reimbursable meal is selected.

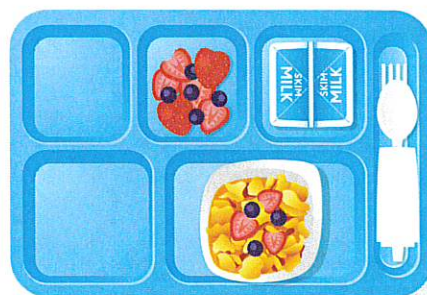
*Water does not count as one of the three required food components and cannot be served as a substitute for milk.

Is it Reimbursable?

For a breakfast to be reimbursable, at least four food items must be offered. Students must select three food items including $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of fruit and/or vegetable for the meal to be reimbursable under OVS.

Use this simple checklist to determine if breakfasts are reimbursable under OVS:

- Does the meal offered consist of at least four food items?
- Does the meal offered include the minimum required amounts of fruits, grains, and milk*?
- Does the meal selected by the student contain at least three food items, including at least $\frac{1}{2}$ cup fruit and/or vegetable?



If the answer to each of these questions is yes, the breakfast meal is reimbursable under OVS.

*Water does not count as one of the three required food components and cannot be served as a substitute for milk.

Additional Tips for OVS Success

- Post signage (with pictures or graphics) near the beginning of each serving line to help students identify how to build a reimbursable meal and wherever student choices are made.
- Ask cashiers to review the reimbursable meal signage before each meal service.
- Keep fruit near the cashier stand so students can easily complete their reimbursable meal.
- Encourage teachers to review the day's menu with students and explain how students can select a reimbursable meal.
- Post menus that highlight required meal components on your school's website and/or on flyers that children can take home to discuss with their parents and caregivers.

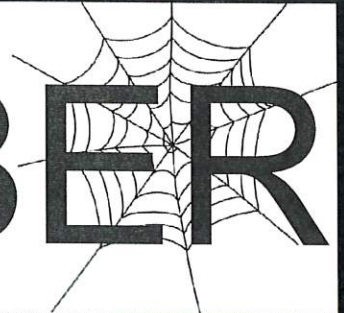

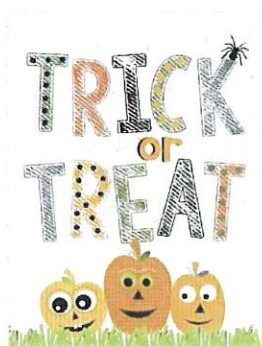
